Diane K. Milner, President, Board of Directors (volunteer) A Carrollton resident, Diane is originally from Colorado and a graduate of the University of Northern Colorado (BA) and Boston University (MA). She taught school in Nebraska, served as an Army Officer with the Engineers Corps, and retired from civil service after 36 years with the Army. She began consigning designer jewelry with the Arts Center@319 in 2011 and joined the Board of Directors in 2013, serving as Vice President and Secretary until her election as President from 2018- 2020, and continues to serve as Vice President since 2021. She was elected Interim President in December 2023 upon the resignation of Priscilla McGreevy. She brings a broad range of experience as an art instructor in New Jersey, art framer in Heidelberg, Germany, and most recently as a jewelry designer. She is a Resident Artist in the Arts Center @319. Her designs are on display in the Arts Center Gift Shop, seasonal festivals in Yorktown, Poquoson, Newport News, Williamsburg, and Smithfield. She is also a returning artist at the Nansemond Suffolk Academy Art Show.

Joseph Graif, Vice President, Board of Directors, (volunteer) Joseph holds a B.A. in music and an M.B.A. in accounting and finance from Columbia University, as well as Colleague and Choirmaster certifications from the American Guild of Organists. He is enjoying a 56-year career as a pastoral musician and worked over 40 years as a financial executive, on Wall Street and at large Public Accounting firms. During that time, Joseph concertized at Saint Patrick's Cathedral and Trinity Church in New York City, The New York Military Academy and Radio City Music Hall. Now, in "retirement," he and his wife, Susan, have formed the Susan A. & Joseph N. Graif Foundation Inc. through which they will support the musical performing arts in Isle of Wight County. Joseph also serves as President of the Old Dominion Theatre Organ Society, the local chapter of the American Theatre Organ Society. He joined the IWAL board in 2023.

Deborah J. Duncan, Secretary, Board of Directors, (volunteer) Deborah was born in London, England and moved to Southern California with her family when she was 14. She has a BA in Psychology from California State University Fullerton, followed by eclectic work experience. While in CA she worked at Applied Solar Energy Corporation as a photo lithographer, and at Landmark Medical Center, a locked psychiatric facility, as a counselor. In 2006 she moved, with her family, to the Philippines for four years in order to work with IDEA, a foundation working to educate impoverished and neglected deaf children. The family returned to the U.S. and Virginia 2015 and opened Wharf Hill Brewing Company in downtown Smithfield. She enjoys working backstage at the Smithfield Little Theater, volunteering for Smithfield VA Events, and spending time with her three sons. Deborah works for Isle of Wight Tourism as a docent and tour guide. She has a love of the arts in all its forms: music, visual arts, and the theater. She joined the Board of Directors in 2018 and was elected Secretary in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

T. Dru Stowe, Treasurer, Board of Directors, (volunteer), Dru Stowe is the owner and general manager of MurSto Productions, an entertainment production firm in Smithfield, Virginia. As an instrumental musician, he has performed in numerous ensembles both locally and internationally. He worked at Busch Gardens Williamsburg for 29 years where he supervised music and special events. Since its creation in 2008, he has been the Executive Director for the Sundays at Fours Chamber series and subsequently became a member of the Isle of Wight Arts League Board. He has served as Vice President, President, and Treasurer.

Sheila W. Gwaltney, Arts Center Director (staff), Sheila joined the Arts League board in 2006 and was appointed Director of the Arts Center @ 319 in 2007. In 2008 she sought partnership with Smithfield-Isle of Wight Tourism Bureau and assisted in planning the space shared by the Arts Center and Tourism's Visitors Center. The project was ultimately recognized in 2009 by the Virginia Downtown Development Association's Award of Excellence for Organizational Development. Mrs. Gwaltney has been an Isle of Wight Arts League Resident Artist since 2005 and exhibits her work locally and in regional arts venues.




